- Using engineered Croslite material that makes each boot up to 40% lighter than the traditional rain boot
- By incorporating Croslite material, the shoe will also be scientifically proven to have health benefits by podiatrists
- Adding ultra light Crocs Comfort soles to keep the light weight while still providing support for the arches of the feet.

To promote the new line of shoes, Crocs will work first to campaign towards young college audiences through campus ambassadorship programs in large, urban college campuses across the nation. These campus programs include

booths on campus where students will have the opportunity to see the shoes in real life and try them on with live "puddle tests".
